President's Report

I am pleased to present the 2010 Annual Report to members and stakeholders of Tennis Townsville Inc (hereinafter referred to as 'TTI'). 2010 was a busy and exciting year with a number of highlights.

Marketing Position

The creation of a Marketing Manager position was a serious decision with some large risks involved. The committee considered the benefits that such a position would bring Tennis Townsville as against the cost of the position. The full time position costs in excess of \$50,000 a year which would erode the surplus that TTI was generating each year. On the benefit side the new position could reduce the cost of designing and printing of forms (which was being outsourced), generate additional revenue from sponsorships and increased tennis activities as well as increasing the publicity for tennis. The increased in revenue to result from marketing the junior development programs especially Saturday morning Hot Shot program and encouraging the business community to participate in more tennis activities. TTI approached Tennis Queensland (TQ) for assistance with funding of the position for a period of three years. TQ never replied officially. However, this is the sort of venture that TQ should encourage in the interest of tennis in this state. The TTI committee's key financial performance target for the new position is:

- 2011 TTI would bear the full cost of the position and with the additional revenue would be minimal.
- 2012 generate additional revenue of at least \$25,000.
- 2013 generate additional revenue to cover the full cost of the marketing position.

At the start of the year Yolanda Garcia was appointed as Marketing Manager for a period of 6 months and during that period she:

- Created a media release template, distribution lists and entered contacts.
- Generated a Media Partner Proposal document.
- Posted content on TCC Calendar of Events website and other local organisation.
- Created and designed a new generic Sponsorship Proposal document.
- Created a proposal for the sponsorship of Tennis Boot Camp by Drake International.
- Coordinated funding support for Lizette Cabrera's trip to Europe.
- Created the "Courtside" newsletter and distributed it monthly to members.
- Established new business partnership with Prime Radio (subsidized ads through 106.3 & Zinc 100.7).
- Set up business tools for the position including: distribution lists, contacts, templates, email signatures, reports, proposals for communication and marketing.

In August 2010 Karolien Selen was appointed, for a period of two years, as Business Development and Marketing Manager. The role was expanded to include the creation of additional revenue streams through sponsorship, grants, new programs, activities, functions and events. During the last 6 months Karolien has:

- Consistently released media news of tennis activities increasing tennis profile in Townsville.
- Met with various media to create better relationship.
- Designed entry forms and other activity forms reducing costs by not outsourcing.
- Emailed the "Courtside" newsletter each month to members.
- Made improvements in social media- using social media tools to lift the profile of Tennis Townsville, re-launched Facebook and looking at twitter.
- Renewing sponsorship deals with current sponsors and organising new court signage.
- Approached new businesses and sent through sponsorship proposal.
- Updated website and working towards upgrading the website.
- Launched Broadband for seniors program.
- Produced 2011 Tennis Townsville Program.

Grants Submissions

Tennis Townsville was very active, during the year, in preparing and submitting various grants to state and local Governments. For some applications we used commercial organisations to prepare costing, drawings and assisting with the preparation of submission to ensure that the applications were professionally presented. The outsourcing of the works cost the Club \$11,000. The following submissions were made during the year.

- Queensland Gambling Community Benefit Fund to replace current fence on courts 2 to 7 on Sports Reserve side and the application was for \$26,800 and TTI contribution of \$5,000. The application was successful and work will be carried out by North Queensland Fencing in April 2011.
- Queensland Gambling Community Benefit Fund to install solar panels and solar water heater at the cost of \$11,770. This should reduce power usage for the club. The application was successful and works will be carried out by Solar House Australia before end of April 2011.
- Sport and Recreation Active Inclusion Program to conduct a number of 'come and try' days costing \$5,000. The application was successful and the come and try days are scheduled for February (adult) and May (children).
- Townsville City Council Heritage program for funding to assist with the production of a publication – History of Tennis Townsville. The successful application was \$2,500. The publication to be released in August during the 100 years centenary celebration.
- Queensland Government Sport and Recreation Infrastructure program for the redevelopment of the seven tennis courts in Queens Park. The project is to create a walk way and fences between the courts and replace the asphalt with concrete on the three courts managed by Townsville Tennis Club. The total cost of this project is estimated to be \$600,000. First application was submitted in March and the second one in September. On both occasions the Department advised that the application met all the criteria and was submitted to the Minister for consideration. The answer on both occasions was unsuccessful.
- In December an expression of interest was submitted for 2011 for the Healthy Queensland Awards program. The awards present an opportunity to win \$750,000 or \$50,000. As part of the submission TTI indicated that if it was successful in winning the award it would use the funds to upgrade courts 8 and 9, landscape and shade the whole complex. The chances of winning this award are very low. Awards will be announced in the middle of the year

Junior Development Program

TTI continued its focus on the development of juniors in the region. The junior pathway commences with the MLC Junior Hot Shots program (children as young as 4 years of age) progressing to the Dentist on Paxton Junior Fixtures. This is followed by the Townsville Orthodontic Specialist Junior Development Squad (aimed at tournament players). The pathway ultimately leads to the Pickering dmG Touring Squad, an invitational elite squad. The pathway has produced an increased number of juniors on the Australian Rankings.

Tournaments

TTI was host to 3 major Tournaments; North Queensland Wheelchair Tennis Championships, North Queensland Open Championships and North Queensland Junior Age Championships. The events attracted many high profile players and was well supported by the community and local businesses. The tournaments' atmosphere is fun and exciting and creates a real buzz amongst the players and their supporters. TTI also held the Tennis Townsville Championships, which had a great turn out. TTI had a 100% increase in entries compared to the previous years with 46 singles and 45 doubles pairs competing in 143 matches over the weekend.

Memberships

Townsville is a very transient destination; however the population is continuing to grow each year. TTI has recorded a small decrease in membership numbers in 2010. TTI will continue to create new programs and improve current programs to attract and retain members.

Kalynda Chase Tennis Centre

It is a great new complex which should lift the interest in the game of tennis in the Townsville region. The new complex houses 10 tennis courts and a clubhouse. The TTI management committee decided against submitting a tender to manage Kalynda Chase Tennis Centre. However, the committee is looking forward to working together with the Kalynda Chase management in developing the profile and game of tennis in the Townsville region.

Upgrade to Website

In conjunction with the *Serving up 100 Years of Tennis in Townsville* celebrations TTI will upgrade its website and this will include installing Content Management Software, creating template, creating new design, creating sitemap. The website will be upgraded over the next 12 months.

Federal Elections

During the Federal elections the management committee presented a case for the construction of a new clubhouse on the site to both candidates for the seat of Herbert - Tony Mooney and Ewan Jones. However, the candidates apparently did not consider the proposal was a vote catcher.

Tennis Boot Camp- Cardio Tennis

Towards the end of the year TTI introduced a low keyed fitness program. The program for 2011 has been renamed to Tennis Boot Camp with the first camp commencing in March. Tennis Boot Camp combines a high intensity cardio workout including tennis drills to provide a unique way of getting fit while learning a new skill. The program is a fun group activity for all ages and abilities and features tennis drills, cardio work-outs, warm up and cool down phases. The program is sponsored by Drake International.

Facelift to Clubhouses and grandstand

With no noticeable development to the complex TTI committee decided that it would paint the clubhouse yellow and the grandstand grey. The clubhouse was painted by our caretaker, Norm Earl, over Christmas and the painting of grandstand will be done by Ken Karlin and his Monday night tennis mates once the wet season is over.

Townsville Grammar School Lease

Tennis Townsville has an 8 year lease agreement with Townsville Grammar School for the school to lease land (behind the caretaker's accommodation) on which the Townsville Grammar School has constructed class rooms. Tennis Townsville management committee has agreed to extend the lease for another five years; the current lease expired in January 2011.

Computer Assistance for Seniors (Broadband)

Tennis Townsville has entered into an agreement with NEC and the Australian Government to provide to senior members of the community a learning support in computer programs. The program will include internet browsing, email, word processing and the use of spreadsheets. This facility will be provided free of charge to seniors and disabled groups at the Tennis Townsville centre.

Serving up 100 Years of Tennis

2011 will be an exciting milestone for the organization and local community, as we celebrate our 100 Year Anniversary. For the last 12 months Pauline Shield has been gathering history on Tennis Townsville from various sources including libraries and James Cook University. Michael Kern (chairman) and his committee are working towards celebrating the anniversary on 5th, 6th and 7th August. A big program is planned which includes family and veterans tournaments and a gala dinner night.

Night Fixtures 2010

Again Tennis Townsville experienced an increase of 11 teams compared to 2009. Total of 128 teams took part during the year. The night fixtures held Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays are popular because of even competition and the nights are fun with great atmosphere. Robyn, Pauline and Mary go to a lot of trouble to make the fixtures popular and interesting for players. Raffles are held on some nights, lucky teams drawn also receive prizes. They are great evenings. The main sponsors of the fixtures are Angus Smith Sportspower and Dean Dank Real Estate.

Corporate Fun Night

A Corporate Fun Night was held on Friday 17 September, 2010. 34 people attended making up 6 teams with some of the teams bringing along supporters. The Corporate Fun night was sponsored by Lion Nathan (Hahn Super Dry) and Heritage Bar & Grill, Cactus Jack Restaurant and Reef Thai Restaurant.

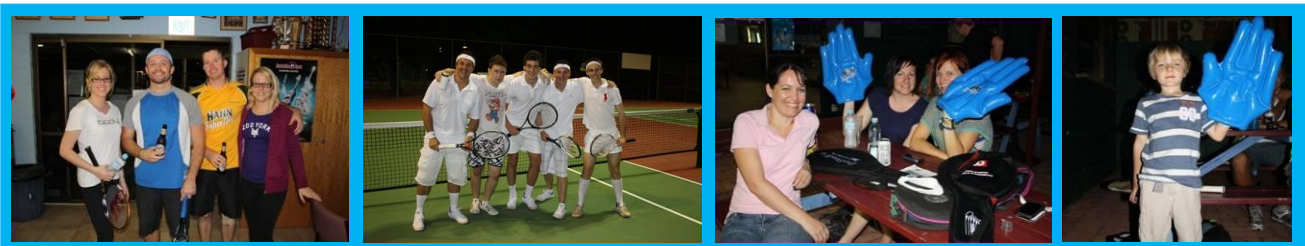
Road to the Davis Cup

- We receive excellent support from our volunteers.

The successes, improvements and development that we have achieved is due to the, vision, time and effort that the staff, volunteers and players have provided. It has been an honour to serve in the capacity of President. I look forward to taking a much lower role on the Management Committee in the future.

Junior Development Programs

TTI continued its comprehensive junior pathway for the development of juniors in the district. Juniors as young as 4 years of age were able to commence on a pathway to the wonderful world of tennis enabling them to enjoy the game for the rest of their lives. The pathway included:

- **MLC Tennis Hot Shots Saturday Morning Program** is Tennis Australia's official kids starter program designed to teach young people how to play the game of tennis. The exciting new format uses modified racquets and reduced court sizes for the very young players. The higher level programs were well attended and included Dentist on Paxton Junior Fixtures. The Saturday morning sessions averaged in excess of 60 players each session.
- **Come and Try Day** was held on the 6th February and attracted 72 children.
- **Townsville Orthodontic Specialists Training Squads** were held on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons and provided an intensive development program for young players moving to fixtures and tournaments. These squads averaged 20 players per session.
- **Dentist on Paxton Saturday Afternoon Junior Fixtures** Only 1 season was held in early 2010. The Junior Fixtures were not held in the second half of 2010; however in 2011 fixtures will be held right after the MLC Hot Shots on Saturday mornings.
- **Pickerings dmj Touring Squad** provided players with assistance to meet travelling expenses to various tournaments. The players showed vast improvement in their game and all had notable victories in various tournaments. Congratulations to all the players selected in this program. The players were also supported by the association coaches at the tournaments and the squad included the following (the Australian ranking at end of the year is shown in the brackets);

Players continue to show improvement in their skills and knowledge of the game and are climbing the Australian rankings.

- Four **Junior School Holiday Clinics** were held during the school holidays and they averaged 45 players per clinic. The last 2 School Holiday Clinics were sponsored by Officeworks who provided participants with a drink bottle, hat and certificate.

Tennis Townsville conveys its appreciation to Wayne Hannah and Peter Duncan, our high level coaches and they were supported excellently by coaches and junior instructors. Windmill Bricklaying North Queensland Open Tennis Championships 2010 16-18 July, 2010

The North Queensland Tennis Championships was the main event of the year for Tennis Townsville. Despite the problem with the date the championships attracted a lot of players from Queensland as well as from interstate. 398 entries were received with 40 participants taking part in the open mens singles. The event was an Australian Silver ranking tournament. Total prize money and trophies paid out in the championships was \$10,585 with open singles winners receiving \$900 plus a \$200 watch from Loloma Jewellers.

Ergon Energy North Queensland Junior Tennis Championships 2010 26-28 September, 2010



Townsville



A record number of 289 entries were received from juniors across Australia just proving how popular these championships are becoming. The Ergon Energy Championships was a Silver Series ranked Tennis Australia event with points awarded in the 12, 14 and 16 age groups.

There were some excellent performances by our local players including:

- Lizette Cabrera who captured the 14U and 16U girls singles and 14U girls doubles.
- Seth Siriya provided the crowd with some great tennis taking out 16U boys singles and doubles.
- Lachlan Kern put in a great effort during the tournament winning the 16U and 18U boys doubles.
- Mikayla Zahirovic is definitely one young player to keep an eye on. Mikayla 8 years of age won the 10U mixed doubles and was runner up in 10U girls singles and girls doubles.

Finance Report

Tennis Townsville incurred a loss of \$20,911 for the financial ended 31 December 2010 compared to a profit of \$157,978 in 2009. TTI financial statements are based on accrual accounting which takes into account non-cash items such as Depreciation. 2009 large profit was due to receipt of grants from Queensland Government of \$145,382 for the construction of court 1 and other capital items. In 2010 even though TTI was successful in obtaining some capital grants they do not appear in 2010 financial statements as the work will be carried out in 2011.

TTI bottom line was impacted by \$8,654 spent on redevelopment preliminary cost associated with the preparation of professional plans, drawings and costing for submission of application for funding to Queensland Government Infrastructure Program on Queens Park courts as well as submission to the Queensland Health Awards. The other major impact was from the employment of Marketing and Business Development Manager and the management committee knew that the position would have the impact. The unfavourable weather conditions also resulted in loss of revenue. We had at least 10 rain affected nights in the night fixture. Most of the revenue showed a reduction including canteen, night fixtures, membership fees, sponsorship and grants recorded a reduction of \$147,059. The overall income for 2010 was down by \$159,406 compared to previous year. The only increase in revenue was with the increase in tournament fees, was up by \$5,389.

Expenses for the year totalled \$420,357 an increase of \$20,910 over previous year. Major increases were:

- \$43,145 in wages and contractor cost result of employment of marketing person, gathering history records and wage rates increases;
- \$1,816 Electricity costs despite less power used due to wet conditions, there was an increase of 15%.
- \$9,420 in prizes and prize money for tournaments

On cash basis TTI had positive cash inflow of \$24,949. In other words the 2010 operations improved TTI cash flow by \$24,949.

Total cash in bank and investments as at 31 December 2010 was \$235,150 of which \$72,031 is committed to repayment of unsecured notes due for repayment end of 2011. The rest of the cash is being held for the refurbishment of Queens Park court.

The local business community continued to support TTI despite the poor condition of the economy. The revenue from the business community for the year was \$79,862 down by \$4,044 on 2009.
